Dear Members:

As 2022 is drawing to a close, it is time to reflect on the year that is ending, and plan for the next year.

The club ended 2022 with the traditional Christmas Dinner on December 17th. It was held at the Easton VFW and was attended by 33 members and guests. We were happy to see those members who have not attended any of our functions for a while.

I thank Diann Prahl for arranging the dinner. It was especially challenging for her this year as her regular contact person had passed away and she had to deal with the chef, who usually prepared the meal but did not do the other functions of putting on an event. The dinner came off well despite a few bumps along the way.

Andy Wilhelm swore in the new officers and directors. Club leadership remains the same, except Charles Emery moves from director to Vice President, Lee Caplan leaves office, and Charlotte Morris comes in as the new director.

I thanked Craig Duerling for his work keeping the website up to date and arranging for the Zoom hookups for the meetings. Ken Briers was given a gift certificate to Suicide Bridge Restaurant for his work on the newsletter and arranging for the Summer Picnic, which was to be held at his Choptank home but had to be cancelled at the last minute.

As is tradition we collected donations at the dinner, had the club match up to \$400, and gave the money to charity. This year the money went to Delmarva Community Services, Inc. for vouchers for veterans' transportation. (In later emails I misidentified the organization as Dorchester Community Services, but the checks should be honored.) Delmarva Community Services received \$915 from the club and its members.

What is the challenge for 2023? We continue to need organizers for Lunch Bunch outings. Carol Grant has agreed to lead one, but it is a warm weather event so it will happen later in

the year. We need organizers for January and February. I would like some of the outings to have a feature destination, like we did in past years, in addition to lunch: a museum, private collection or anything that may be of interest to club members. I still need lunch outing planners, even if you don't have an extra stop in mind. Maybe we could work something out in addition.

For the major club functions: Summer Picnic and Christmas Dinner, I would like to see some entertainment or interactive activity to go along with the meal. I am open to suggestions and plan to make seeking suggestions a regular item on the agenda so we can get members brainstorming.

AACA will hold its Annual Meeting from February 9<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> in Williamsburg, VA. I have information available, if anyone is interested in going. Registration deadline is January 25.

We will continue to hold our general membership meetings at the Easton Elks Club on the third Wednesday of the month. The next meeting is January 18<sup>th</sup>, beginning with lunch at Noon, followed by the meeting, starting at 1:00 pm. We will revisit the timing of the meetings later in the year, as the days become longer.
