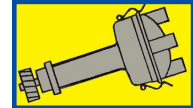

We will end with a parade around the grounds, after which you are on your own.

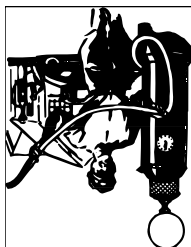
